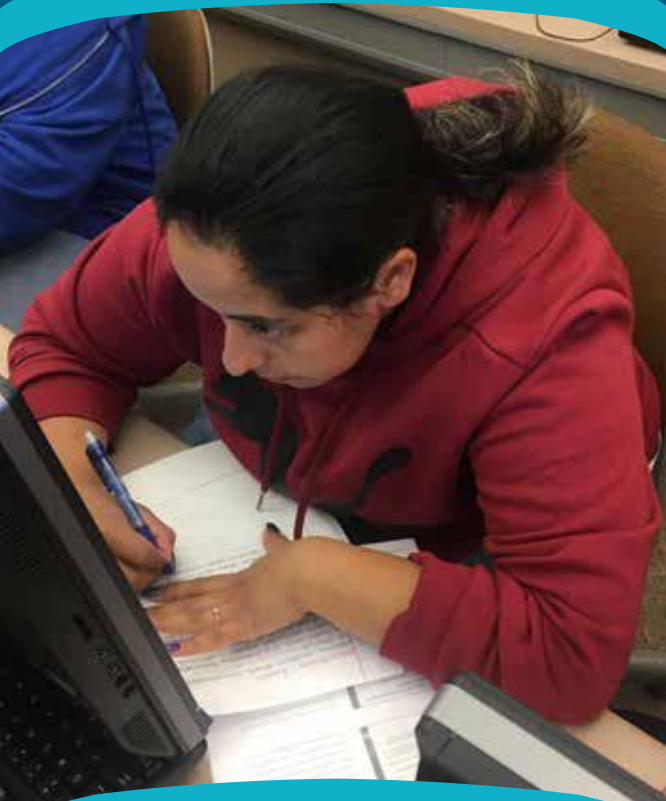


College to Career



About College to Career (C2C)

The North Orange County Community College District (NOCCCD) is one of eight educational institutions selected statewide to receive funding from the Department of Rehabilitation for College to Career (C2C) funding. C2C provides educational supports designed to promote inclusion of students with Intellectual Disabilities (ID) into postsecondary education while pursuing individualized employment goals.

NOCCCD works in partnership with the Regional Center of Orange County, the Department of Rehabilitation, faculty, and employers to provide prevocational and vocational services to students with ID.

C2C enrollment ranges from one to three years, and includes educational and vocational support related to student employment goals, job placement, and job support as needed.

What is C2C?

The purpose of College to Career (C2C) is to improve employment outcomes for individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ID). Through inclusion in postsecondary education, persons with ID can expand the range of jobs available to them. C2C students will receive additional educational and vocational support including:

- Assistance with coursework
- Access to adaptive technology
- Support in study skills
- Notetaking strategies
- Organizational techniques
- Employment readiness preparation
- Job placement assistance

Student Eligibility

Students are eligible if they:

- Are eligible by Department of Rehabilitation (DOR)
- Have a documented diagnosis of an intellectual disability
- Are at least 18 years of age
- Desire to obtain Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE)

C2C Program Enrollment

C2C accepts 20 new students each year. Applications are available through the North Orange Continuing Education (NOCE) Disability Support Services (DSS) office between January to April of each year.

C2C Program Participants Must

- Be Highly motivated to be employed
- Have a desire to engage in postsecondary education, including participation in main stream classes and campus activities
- Demonstrate the ability to meet academic demands of community college classes with the level of support available through C2C
- Have the ability to work, with decreasing support, in an independent job placement following C2C
