

# Disability Support Services



*The North Orange Continuing Education (NOCE) Disability Support Services (DSS) provides accommodations such as alternate media and interpreting services to students with verified disabilities enrolled in NOCE courses. Additionally, DSS offers classes designed to empower students to reach their educational, vocational and personal goals so they can transition into more independent living and working opportunities in the community.*

*While attending classes part-time, students are encouraged to seek employment, or to participate in some type of volunteer work.*

When you receive your Banner ID #, call the DSS Office at 714.484.7057 to schedule an appointment with a DSS counselor. Bring a verification of your disability, recent school records, and any other documentation that may assist in preparing an educational plan, if possible.

## The DSS Educational Courses

### Schedule of Classes

Each three-class sequence begins in the Fall and concludes in the Spring. However, students are able to begin sequences mid-year if space permits. A separate six-week Summer intersession is also offered at each campus. Visit [www.noce.edu](http://www.noce.edu) for current offerings.

- Demonstrate measured progress toward vocational, educational and/or personal goals
- Adhere to the mutually agreed upon schedule of classes
- Independently use the restroom and tend to personal care needs or has made arrangements for a Personal Care Attendant
- Maintain 90% attendance, including arriving to class on time
- Adhere to District Student Code of Conduct
