The Orange County Asperger's Support Group (OCASG) is pleased to announce the second annual Jameson Whittaker Memorial Scholarship, that will be awarded to an incoming high school senior or recent high school graduate who has been diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and has demonstrated kindness and resilience in overcoming life's challenges.

The scholarship is in memory of Jameson Daniel Edward Whittaker, a special young man who tragically passed away six years ago when he fell while visiting the Grand Canyon in Arizona on a family vacation. Jameson was the son of Larry and Dr. Deborah Whittaker. He grew up in Irvine and led his life demonstrating a beautiful mind and spirit. After his death, Dr. Deborah Whittaker was asked to join the Orange County Asperger's Support Group board, where she serves today as a board member and as secretary of the organization.
