- The Mission of the Program for Adults with Disabilities
- To provide life, employment, and foundational educational skills to students with intellectual, developmental, and/or learning disabilities through specialized curriculum. To provide students with the opportunity to earn a certificate of completion, transition into competitive wage employment, or transfer to credit classes.

Program Certificates

- Every class is connected to a program certificate.
- Certificates typically have 2 to 3 classes connected to them.
- Certificates are approved and recognized by the State Chancellor.

Classes

- 17 AWD classes and 4 SSD classes are taught during various semesters
- Classes are either on campus or online
 - On campus means in a classroom on the college campus or off site
 - Online means working remotely using a computer or phone that has
 internet access

Typical Schedule

- On campus classes are block scheduled
 - Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday 9am to 11am or 11am to 1pm (times may vary)
 - Online classes are accessible 24 hours, 7 days a week via the internet

Students can take as many classes as they'd like during the semester.



Suggested Student Criteria

- Students in the Adults with Disabilities Program should be able to:
 - Benefit from education in a group setting
 - Productively perform academic work independently with minimal assistance from instructor and IA
 - Follow directions and stay on task for a reasonable period of time
 - Maintain a satisfactory attention span to benefit from an 50 minutes of continuous instruction in a setting with distractions
 - Use sufficient language comprehension skills to benefit from the class
 - Participate in meaningful classroom activities
 - Use receptive and/or expressive language
 - Use appropriate behavioral and emotional responses



Student Code of Conduct

Students who are taking college classes, on campus or online, must be able to abide by the Student Code of Conduct.

Appropriate behavioral and emotional responses are extremely helpful for following the Student Code of Conduct.
