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DISMISSAL OF CRIMINAL CASES

Penal Code section 1203.4 (Formerly expungement of criminal records)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any adult who had been granted and *successfully completed probation*, either by fulfilling the conditions of probation or being discharged before the end of his/her probationary period.

He/She must not be on probation or serving a sentence for any other offense. (Penal Code § 1203.4)

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN AN EXPUNGEMENT AND A DISMISSAL?

The terms are used interchangeably in California regarding 1203.4 motions, however the word "expungement" is misleading by common definition. To "expunge" means "to strike out, obliterate...efface completely, destroy, blot-out, erase, wipe out, annihilate, annul, or put an end to". In criminal law "expungement" means "the eradication of a record of conviction or adjudication upon the fulfillment of prescribed conditions. In practical terms, the conviction is not "erased" from public view. Anyone who has access to public court websites can still view the case information. However, the disposition of the case will reflect that it was "dismissed".

WHAT ARE THE EFFECTS OF THE DISMISSAL?

IT WILL:

- 1. Result in the verdict or plea of guilty being set aside;
- 2. Allow you to answer on job applications that you have not been convicted. If however, you are applying for a government job or a job which requires a government-issued license, certificate or permit, or a job which involves a security clearance, the conviction will be discovered in such cases, you should disclose the conviction and its expungement.
- 3. If the conviction was for a felony, it is the first step in obtaining a pardon.

IT WILL NOT:

- 1. Remove the conviction from your "Rap Sheet" California and FBI criminal history records will still show the conviction and a dismissal "per PC 1203.4";
- 2. Reinstate the right to possess firearms (reduction to a misdemeanor may accomplish this if the offense is not one of violence;)
- 3. Allow you to omit the conviction from applications for government issued licenses;
- 4. Seal or otherwise remove the court case file from public inspection anyone who knows where to look will be able to find the court case file (probation reports are in confidential files and are not subject to public inspection 90 days after sentencing);
- 5. Prevented the conviction from being used as a" prior" to increase punishment in case of subsequent conviction;
- 6. Prevent the conviction from being used for impeachment purposes if called as a witness;
- 7. Prevent the conviction from being considered and used to refuse or revoke government licenses and permits such as teaching credential, nursing license, bus driver's license, security guard certificate, etc., however, the expungement usually reduces the weight given the conviction by the licensing agency.;
- 8. Eliminate the conviction from consideration for immigration purposes.

HOW IS IT DONE?

If you seek a Dismissal on a Felony, contact the Office of the Public Defender 14 Civic Center Plaza, Santa Ana, and ask for the New Leaf Paralegal.

5.	Describe your past lifestyle and why you believe it caused your criminal offenses.
6.	Describe your present lifestyle and explain why it has enabled you to be arrest/conviction free.
