# Intellectual Disabilities Program

Coastline's ID Program offers classes designed especially for students with mild to moderate ID. The classes are non-credit and are free.

# Application Process

- ▶ Student/Family Inquiry
- ▶ ID Application Packet
- ▶ Verification of Disability
- ▶ File Review and Interview
- ▶ Enrollment

# Student Eligibility

Coastline Community College is committed to providing an education to qualified students with disabilities. Eligibility for state funding to provide such services, however, requires that the college obtain professional certification of each student's disability.

Accepted documents for verification of disability:

- ▶ High school documents
- ▶ Regional Center of Orange County
- ▶ Doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist

# Types of Classes Offered



- ▶ Academic Growth – critical thinking, math concepts, reading/writing
- ▶ Community Awareness – community resources, consumer skills
- ▶ Enrichment – music, art, and customs, cultures, and holidays
- ▶ Fitness – adult fitness, rhythmic movement, aerobics
- ▶ Independent Living – applied academics, food preparation, health concepts
- ▶ Social Skills – personal and social adjustment, communication
- ▶ Technology – introduction to computers, desktop publishing

# The COAST Program is:

- ▶ a unique vocational program for adults with ID and autism
- ▶ offers job and employability skills training in professional settings
- ▶ each program runs on a cohort model
- ▶ program length varies, typically 2-4 semesters
- ▶ free non-credit courses in popular employment areas

When all classes are successfully completed, students earn a Certificate of Completion in their field of study.

# Comprehensive Learning



- ▶ State Regional Centers and employers advocate for training in basic employment skills to help students improve their day-to-day professionalism in pursuit of lasting vocational opportunities.
- ▶ Each program was designed to include not only basic career course work, but also employability (first) skill development courses designed to support job placement and retention.

# Student Eligibility

- ▶ Independence
- ▶ Social Maturity
- ▶ Motivation to participate in the program
- ▶ Student participation is required to demonstrate measurable progress
  - ▶ Ability to sit in a classroom setting, listen and benefit from instruction
  - ▶ Ability to be independent in providing all personal and/or self care needs
  - ▶ Ability to get to class independently – on time and for the full class period

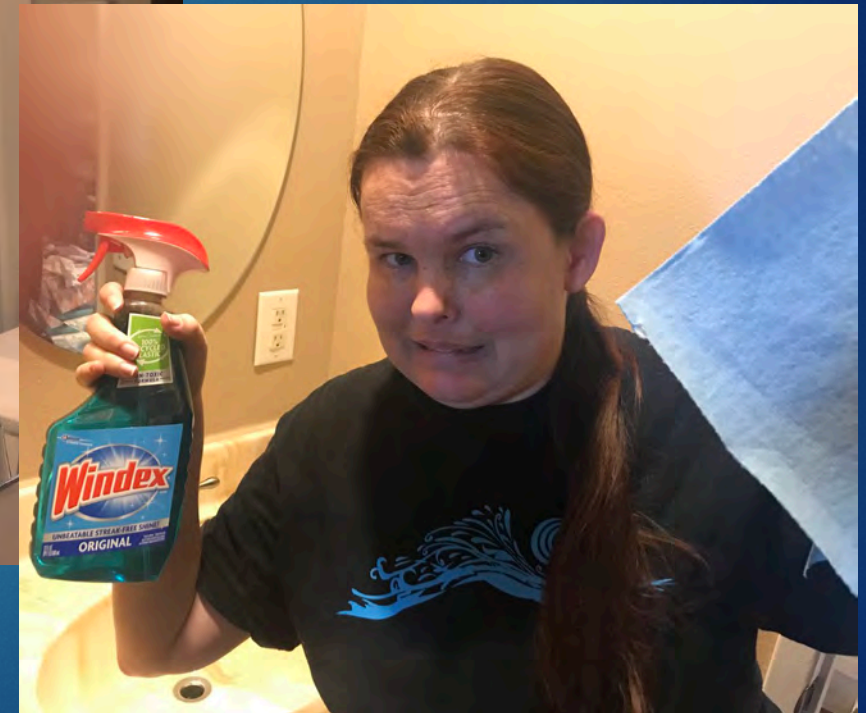

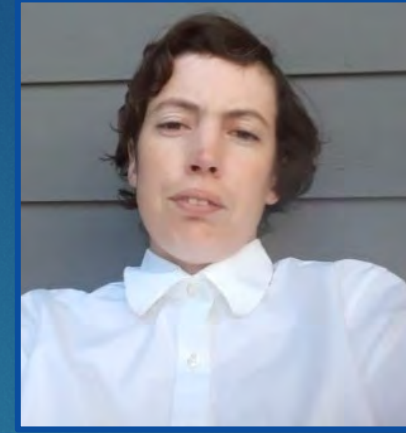
