### 2. Social Security Administration Fact Sheet

#### Social Security & Supplemental Security Income (SSI): What’s the Difference?

There is often confusion about Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) because you apply for both programs with the Social Security Administration.

**But, the programs are different.**

The Social Security benefit programs are “entitlement” programs. This means that workers, employers and the self-employed pay for the benefits with their Social Security taxes. The taxes that are collected are put into special trust funds. You qualify for these benefits based on your work history (or your spouse or parent). The amount of the benefit is based on these earnings.

SSI is a needs-based program for people with limited income and resources. Resources are assets or things that you own. The program is paid for by general tax revenues -- not from the Social Security trust funds. The benefit amount is based on Federal and State laws which take into account where you live, who lives with you and what income you receive.

### 3. What is a 504 Plan? What is the difference between a 504 Plan & and IEP?

“Based on Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. This federal Act prohibits

the discrimination of students with disabilities in public school systems and ensures these students receive the educational supports they need to succeed in school.



If a student’s disability does not impair them enough to need specialized education services, then a 504 may be obtained (if the student is qualified) instead of an IEP.”

Extended reality (XR) is an umbrella term to describe virtual, augmented, and mixed reality technologies. XR is changing the way we interact with the world around us and will, undoubtedly, shape the future of work. In fact, companies are already using these immersive technologies to train staff, enhance collaboration, and market products and services.

As XR becomes more widespread, many people stand to benefit from using these systems in their everyday lives. In the workplace, XR can be a powerful tool for employers, employees, and job seekers. It has the potential to support mission-critical functions, increase productivity, and remove barriers to employment. Yet, if XR is not developed with inclusivity and accessibility at the forefront, people with disabilities may be left behind.

The Partnership on Employment & Accessible Technology (PEAT) created this Toolkit to help employers understand the value of using accessible extended reality (XR) technologies in hybrid work environments. After reading this Toolkit, you will better understand how to procure accessible XR technologies for your workplace. You will also learn how to use these technologies in ways that include all employees equally,

#### 6. Department of Justice, Service Animal Information



The Department of Justice continues to receive many questions about how the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) applies to service animals. The ADA requires State and local government agencies, businesses, and non-profit organizations (covered entities) that provide goods or services to the public to make “reasonable modifications” in their policies, practices, or procedures when necessary to accommodate people with disabilities. The service animal rules fall under this general principle. A service animal needs to do a task for the person with a disability that it helps. The task must be something you can watch the animal do.

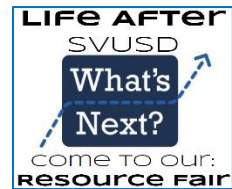

## 21. Disability Rights California Social Security Attorney Referral List

Please see the list of resources that may be of help to you. We do not know if any of the attorneys on this list will be able to take your case. You will have to ask them.

We do not have information about the fees the attorneys on this list charge. We do not have information about whether or not the attorneys on this list have malpractice insurance. You will have to ask them.

The State Bar of California recommends that before you meet with any attorneys you do some "comparison shopping." Call several lawyers and ask questions that might help you make your decision.

- Ask about the attorney's experience and when he or she last handled a similar case.
- Ask about fees.
- Ask about whether the attorney has malpractice insurance.
- Write down what the attorneys have to say.
- Take time to think it over.
- Then choose the attorney who seems right for you.
